The purpose of this video is for JxmyHighroller to review the rankings of the 75 Greatest Players list and then to use his own metrics to find out who is the 75 greatest players based on multiple factors. In his rankings, he used multiple metrics in determining which players are on the list and where they should be ranked. He used categories such as impact on the game, most dominant player during their time, best scorer, accolades, and many others as well. He made sure to try and not put any bias into the rankings and to not include the longevity of some players compared to others, but he did make sure to find ways to include those players' ability to be elite players for years. He used all these categories on a point system with for example, Bill Russel had the most rings out of any player of all time with 11, so he received 22 points in the championships category. The top players in each category earned points and at the end, ranked the greatest 75 players by total points from his system he created. From his rankings, some notable rankings are Wilt Chamberlain at 4, Kevin Durant at 9, Larry Bird at 11, Giannis at 30, Luka Doncic at 42, Dwayne Wade at 47, Nikola Jokic at 71, and others. In the video, he describes that even his list that he made is far from perfect and that ranking players is very subjective whether you use hard stats or not. In this article, Jim Sergent, Ramon Padilla and Mitchell Thorson all are discussing on if LeBron should be considered the GOAT or Greatest of All Time in the NBA after he broke the NBA scoring record once held by Kareem Abdul-Jabbar on February 7, 2023. In the article, they compare the two players on a few different metrics. They compared side-by-side their statistical averages per game, their career points and games played, games played per season, points per shot attempt, points per season, their career accolades, and finally other advanced metrics to see if there's a clear answer on LeBron James being the GOAT. In the categories overall, Jordan has an edge over Lebron in Accolades, games played per season, points per season, points per game and steals per game. Jordan also got to 30,000 points in just 960 games whereas it took LeBron 1,107 games to reach that point. On the flip side, LeBron outmatched Jordan in the advanced

metrics like value over replacement and defensive rating, points per shot attempt (though that has to do with the increase in 3 point attempts in the league compared to Jordan's era), career points, and rebounds, and assist averages per game. In the end, they concluded that both side's have a lot of data points to look at, but LeBron still probably needs a little bit more to secure his case as the GOAT.

The purpose of this article is to use accolades to determine who were the 20 greatest players of the 21st century and to also look at players younger players in the league right now that have the potential to be all time greats this century. In this ranking, he is taking inspiration from the 1997 All Star Weekend where the NBA gathered together what they considered the 50 greatest players in history at the time. In the list he made, he excluded players that were on that original list so players like Shaqullie O'Neal and Dominique Wilins weren't on the list. Furthermore, he is only including players who are in their 10th year or later by the time the article was written so Anthony Davis, Giannis Antetokounmpo and Kyrie Irving were not included ethier. Players on this list included LeBron ranked no 1. Unsurprisingly, with Kobe and Tim Duncan following up right behind him. Furthermore, Curry ranked at 4 right above Kevin Durant, Russel Westbrook at 11 four spots higher than Chirs Paul, and Tracy McGrady at 16 higher than Paul Pierce, Ray Allen, and Dwight Howard. At the time, some of the players he believed could be on the list in the future were the three mentioned earlier, Nikola Jokic, Rudy Gobert, Ben Simmons, Luka Doncic, Deandre Ayton, Klay Thompson, Draymond Green, Zion Williamson despite not even entering the NBA yet, and others.
